
Thank You for Your Support

Caring for the Most Vulnerable

As of November 4, Bolivia has reported more than 142,000 COVID-19 infections and 8,751 related fatalities. The government has extended national quarantine measures indefinitely. Face masks must be worn in public places, social distancing measures must be respected and large public events are suspended. A curfew is in place from 12 midnight to 5 a.m. in some areas. School is canceled, both online and in person, until at least 2021.

Currently, all Compassion centers in Bolivia are closed in order to abide by local guidelines. Our frontline church partners (FCPs) are calling and checking in on registered children and their families, and in some communities they are able to visit children while obeying masking and social distancing guidelines. In light of the pandemic, our FCPs have increased their efforts to take care of the health and nutritional needs of mothers and their children. Center staff keep in contact with families remotely — identifying the most vulnerable, buying and distributing hygiene kits and groceries, and providing spiritual and emotional support. FCPs are also working to create virtual program activity, including educational videos and livestreams, for caregivers and children to use at home.

Families Uplifted Through Your Giving



My name is Mary Elena. I am 21 years old. My husband is Jhony and we have three daughters.

This quarantine in Bolivia has been difficult for many families; in my case it has been very complex. I was pregnant and I had to give birth to my baby during the quarantine. My husband lost his job, and we had to spend all our savings on my Caesarean section. At this time the hospitals are collapsed with Covid-19 patients, and we experienced an odyssey to find a place in a hospital. The hospital where I had my baby was the only one with a bed where I could be tended for emergency, and finally my baby could be born.

My husband was on his way to pick me up from the hospital and suddenly he had a traffic accident. Thank God, it was not serious; he only had pain in a few parts of his body where he got hit. He did not know what to do because of the things that were happening during this time of quarantine.

How You Helped Us

Someone who was of great help was the Survival staff member who transported me to several places to find a hospital and to give me the care I needed. She gave me her support, prayed for our lives, gave me words of encouragement, and with some brothers and sisters from church collected money to help us with the transport and hospitalization expenses.

She is always checking that the family is well, and thanks to her prayers, a few days ago, my husband got a job offer — now he is working, and he will be able to help provide for our family. I am very grateful to God, to my Survival staff member, to the donors who support Survival, and to the whole church in general who are constantly calling on the phone asking if we are well, trying to support us in these difficult days.

The support that the Compassion Survival program has given us is a great blessing. They have also cared for our entire family by providing us with supplementary foods we needed and a hygiene and biosecurity kit to prevent the spread of the coronavirus.

May God bless the kind and generous donors like you who support Compassion Survival. You have helped us in many ways, but especially during this most difficult time.
